

Dogs at Kingscote Barn

We are delighted to welcome dogs to The Kingscote Barn.

We have a couple dog friendly Pods, where you are most welcome to bring your four-legged friends when staying with us. Please pre book and make us aware to guarantee availability as we only have a limited number of rooms suitable. Please read below for more information. 🐾

- We allow a maximum of 2 dogs per room booking. An additional fee of **£30 for 1 dog** or **£50.00 for 2 dogs** will be added to your booking. This fee includes a dog bed, a water bowl, doggy treats, lots of throws, poo bags and a dog towel.
- Our housekeeping team will not service your room or enter your room if your dog is left unattended.
- We welcome well-behaved dogs. However, any disturbance to other guests may result in you being required to remove your dog from the premises. We appreciate accidents can happen; therefore, we ask that you let us know if any accident occurs. Any damage to the room caused by your dog will be assessed by our housekeeping manager and any cost incurred will be charged to your card.
- Dogs should be fully house trained and over the age of 1 year. If your dog fouls inside, a cleaning fee will be added to your bill of £100 and may result in you being required to remove your dog from the site.
- Your four-legged friends are more than welcome to join you for a walk through the estate, maps of all the off-road walking can be obtained from reception. However, your dog does need to be kept on lead throughout the estate at all times. When walking your dog on Public footpaths, please ensure you adhere to the Countryside Code, see section '[Always keep dogs under control and in sight](#)'.
- Dogs are encouraged to stay off the soft furnishings but please use the throws provided to keep things clean.
- Please ensure that you pick up after your dog and dispose of waste responsibly into an outdoor bin.
- You are responsible for your dog and its actions at all times. We strongly advice that you have pet insurance which covers against damage and personal injury including injury other animals or people.
- Guide dogs, assistance dog and hearing dogs are exempt from this charge.
